Weave your way into Eptek Art & Culture Centre for a textile-themed fall. “Surface Tension” is on display until November 9th, exploring themes of loss and abundance, legacy and nostalgia. It features the work of Nancy Cole, Maggie J. Whitten Henry, and Jane M Whitten, three artists based in Epekwitk (Prince Edward Island) who engage dystopian realisms through embroidery, digital media, and recycled materials. The result is a collection of non-traditional textiles which honour traditional methods while inviting and urging us to contemplate, question, and (re)imagine our present and possible futures. The cold weather starting to get to you? Not to worry! Wrap yourself in a room filled with quilts! Beginning on November 22nd, bright colours, contemporary designs, and coziness will be found in “Still Quilting Forward,” featuring work from members of the PEI Modern Quilt Guild. “Wartime Memories from Prince County” will be on display, highlighting WWII artifacts, in partnership with the PEI Regiment Museum. Throughout the fall, learn about women’s voting rights with the exhibition *Perseverance, Persistence and Progress: Women’s Impact on Politics in PEI*, commemorating the centennial of some women starting to gain voting privileges in PEI’s provincial elections.
